I would like to inform you that in reference to the Action Plan for the years 2017-2018-2019 of the Agreement between the Kingdom of Morocco and Hungary signed in 1972, regarding the field of education, Morocco is providing 15 scholarships to Hungarian students wishing to continue their studies in Moroccan public universities, in post graduate of technical and professional disciplines for the academic year 2019/2020.

Taking into consideration that French is the language used in the scientific, technical and economic disciplines, the students not speaking French will be obliged to follow a compulsory language learning program at the International Languages Centre.

Enclosed to this note are the information note concerning the scholarship, a model of the form to fill, the subscription procedures and the information regarding the stay in Morocco.

Application for the above mentioned scholarship should be sent to the Moroccan Agency for International Cooperation AMCI at the latest on the 16th of August 2019, bearing in mind that academic year 2019/2020 is fixed as follows:

\*09th September 2019: for the courses given in French or Arabic

\*1st week of October 2019: for the compulsory courses in French to either study it or enhance it

Candidates selected for the training in Morocco are invited upon their arrival at the Moroccan Agency of International Cooperation to:

\*Be in possession, if necessary, of a long stay visa (student visa);

\*Provide a medical certificate stating that they are vaccinated against infectious and contagious diseases, including tuberculosis.
